	Schedule an appointment with your counselor or the Career Center Specialist to review admission requirements for your colleges/universities and the process for requesting	
	transcripts and counselor recommendation letters. The senior packet has all of the information you will need to request transcripts and counselor recommendation letters!	
	Ask teachers and coaches for recommendation letters. Be ready to provide them with a resume and information regarding how they are to submit the recommendation letter. Be sure to talk with them before you send the link for the recommendation letter!	
	Create your FSA ID and have your parents create theirs too. For more information go to: www.StudentAid.gov/fsaid

MARCH-JUNE Senior Year

Check	Task
	Respond immediately to any requests for information from colleges and financial aid offices. Be sure to
	check your spam folder for messages.
	Read your admission decision letter carefully. You may not have been accepted to your particular major, but may have still been accepted to the college/university. If you are waitlisted or deferred, contact the admissions office to see if there is anything else you might be able to do to improve your odds of being accepted. If you are unclear of your admission decision, take your letter to your counselor or the Career Center Specialist for him/her to help you decipher it.
	Review the financial aid packages from your colleges/universities with your counselor or the Career
	Center Specialist.
	Pay your required deposit for enrollment by May 1, 2019.
	Pay your deposit for room and board if you will be living on campus.
	Register for orientation and placement tests.
	Check with the admissions and the financial aid offices to be sure they have everything they need to complete your enrollment into their college/university.
	Complete the FCPS Senior Survey. This survey ensures that your final transcript will be sent to the college/university you will be attending.
