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What is IB?



IB stands for International Baccalaureate, and it is a educational model that spans many types of programmes. The IB continuum of programmes are **designed to develop well-rounded individuals** who can respond to today's challenges with optimism and an open mind.

IB programs support teachers in nurturing resilient, self-motivated students with the knowledge and purpose needed for lifelong success.

IB focuses on:

- fostering inquiring, knowledgeable, confident, and caring students.
- empowering students to take ownership of their learning and develop future-ready skills for a rapidly changing world.
- preparing students to contribute meaningfully to a better world.



Who should take IB DP courses?

It's not for the "gifted/honors" students; it's for the passionate, curious, and motivated students.

At Edison HS, we encourage every student to take at least 1 IB DP course before they graduate. These courses have the potential to even earn some students college or workplace credits.

Completion of IB DP course work will grant FCPS transcript credit; while completion of the IB DP exam/assessment earns credit for the IB DP transcript.

Certificate Students versus Diploma Candidates



Certificate Students

Every student who completes an IB course and exam earns an IB DP Certificate.

Diploma Candidates

Students must

- Successfully complete courses in the 6 Groups and the IB Core
 - 3 Higher Level (HL) & 3 (Standard Level) SL
- Earn 24/45 points on their IB exams while meeting additional requirements



The IB DP CORE

- Extended Essay: 3,000 4,000-word research paper on a topic of the student's choice
- CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service): experiential learning, assessed by reflective journals on seven learning outcomes via experiences and a project
- **IB Theory of Knowledge (TOK) Class:** a 1.0 course over two years that explores the nature of knowledge and how people think

The Cost of IB Diploma Courses

Diploma Programme

EXAM FEES:

FCPS currently pays test fees for **the first six AP/IB tests** taken by each student for courses in which they are also enrolled for high school credit. For IB core fees for diploma candidates, FCPS will continue to pay these fees for IB Diploma students. The test count is cumulative over a student's FCPS academic career. **For the most up-to-date information, visit: https://www.fcps.edu/ap-ib-test-fees**

Possible Savings:

62% of IB diploma candidates and 56% of IB certificate candidates have received a scholarship. (IB Survey, 2011)

Several IB Diploma Candidates have received scholarships to their colleges/universities for completing IB coursework before taking IB exams

*Each university and college is different as to what exams and scores they will accept for credit. Check their admission information for more details about transferring IB exam credits.



Benefits of the Diploma Courses:

Holistic Development:

IB focuses on developing well-rounded learners with critical thinking, global awareness, and research skills essential for success in the modern world.

Interdisciplinary Learning:

Unlike AP and Dual Enrollment, IB integrates knowledge across subjects, preparing students for complex, real-world problem-solving.



According to a study completed by the IBO:

84% of IB diploma candidate respondents (83% of IB certificate candidate respondents) will be attending a higher education institution of their top choice.

The average acceptance rate of IB students into university/college is **22 percentage points higher** than the average acceptance rate of the total population.

Benefits of IB Coursework

IB students are prepared for college-level coursework:

The UVA study found that, when compared with former Advanced Placement (AP) students, IB students were significantly more likely to indicate that they felt prepared for college-level coursework involving research and found their research skills to be important to future success.

William and Mary recognizes the International Baccalaureate program as extremely rigorous; the best possible preparation for both college work and life in the twenty-first century.



Pathways to the IB Diploma

There is not one set way to earn the diploma. Students must complete a 4-year course plan with the Diploma Coordinator to make sure all requirements are being met.

Planning ahead?

Students should take a language course in middle school that they are interested in following through with in high school.
