What is the Personal Project?

The personal project provides an excellent opportunity for students to produce a truly personal and creative product/outcome that demonstrates their learning in the MYP.

The personal nature of the project is important; the project should revolve around a global context that motivates and interests the individual student.

It consists of three main components:

- 1. A process journal
- 2. Focused topic that leads toward a product/outcome
- 3. A report

The personal project is a required element for all 10th graders in their advisory class at Edison High School.

Each student is assigned a staff member that acts as a supervisor to the student. The supervisor helps the students develop a quality process journal, product/outcome, and report.

Personal Project Assessment

he project is judged against these criteria:

A. Investigating

Students should:

- define a clear goal and global context for the project, based on personal interests
- ii. identify prior learning and subject-specific knowledge relevant to the project
- iii. demonstrate research skills

B. Planning

Students should:

- develop criteria for the product/outcome
- plan and record the development process of the project
- iii. demonstrate self-management skills

C. Taking Action

Students should:

- create a product/outcome in response to the goal, global context and criteria
- ii. demonstrate thinking skills
- iii. demonstrate communication and social skills.

D. Reflecting

Students should:

- evaluate the quality of the product/outcome against their criteria
- reflect on how completing the project has extended their knowledge and understanding of the topic and the global context
- reflect on their development as IB learners through the project

Personal Project encourages and enables students to:

- participate in a sustained, self directed inquiry with a global context.
- generate creative new insights and develop deeper understandings through in-depth investigation.
- demonstrate the skills, attitudes, and knowledge required to complete a project over an extended period of time.
- communicate effectively in a variety of situations.
- demonstrate responsible action through or as a result of learning.
- appreciate the process of learning and take pride in accomplishments.
