
How to Access Counselors

2-YEAR COLLEGE

- Lower tuition while earning general education credits
- Ability to live at home
- You can earn an Associate's Degree after 2 years which can help with employability and earning potential before a bachelor's degree is received
- Guaranteed Admissions Program (offered at NOVA) or similar program in other states
- NOVA Workforce offers Certificate programs-then offers job placement help
- If you transfer to a 4-year college, your diploma will read the name of that college
- No SAT, ACT, Essay or Recommendation letters needed

WORK

While you work, you are:

- Earning money and learning how to manage that money as a young adult
- Gaining real-world experience
- Hopefully, getting hands-on experience in a field that you would like to pursue as a college major and/or career
- Building trades (plumbing, HVAC and electrical) offer many opportunities to get started in a career path that will reward you financially while enjoying the hands on work of these professions.
- You can use Naviance Student to build a resume or reach out to Ms. Cottingham for a template and for revisions. You can also use Canva to create a brilliant resume!
- How to find a job: Online, Job board, Word of Mouth, Career Center and Naviance to search careers that match your interest

VOCATIONAL/TECHNICAL TRAINING

- Most programs offered at Technical schools are completed in approximately 2 years
- These programs provide hands-on training and certifications in many different areas
- The certifications earned help a student increase their earning potential and employability
- NOVA and ACE provide certifications through various trades
 - Electricity, Plumbing, HVAC, Painting, Auto Mechanic, etc.
 - Apprenticeships can be obtained through local unions and area businesses.

4-YEAR COLLEGE

- Visit the schools that you are interested in -virtual visits or inperson!

- View and document the admission requirements and due dates for those schools (create spreadsheet)

Financial Aid

- The FAFSA is the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>—this is the starting point for financial support for your education after high school.
- The CSS Profile is an additional financial aid application required by some colleges (check the college website).

College Application Options

- Early Action apply early and find out acceptance or not earlier; common deadlines November 1 and 15; have until May 1st to respond; could be deferred to regular deadline BRAGE TOURS
- Early Decision student commits to a 1st choice school where if admitted will enroll and withdraw all other applications; binding; can't compare financial aid awards
- Regular Decision General admission deadline
- Rolling Admissions no deadline will accept students as there are spaces available

College Application Process Tips

- Do your research! Know how to apply: Common app, Coalition, Directly via college website...
- Organize yourself make spreadsheets or checklists
- Know your college/universities requirements
 - SATs/ACTs (contact your counselor if you qualify for a fee waiver)
 - Use this <u>form</u> to register for Edison's SAT on 10/11. This form must be completed by 9/6!
 - Letters of Recommendation
 - Fees
 - Deadlines
- Ask your teachers for Letters of Recommendation early
- Give your Senior Packet to your counselor

Student Self-Assessment

- Helps your counselor gather information to write a holistic Letter of Recommendation for you
- Include a Resume
- Details are the best!

Parent Information Form (Optional)

- Helps counselors gather information we may not know about students.
- Parents cannot write letters of recommendation; this is to help counselors.

Teacher Feedback Form (Optional)

- Counselors don't always know how you are in class; we love teacher input!
- Use teachers with whom you've had positive experiences perhaps in a subject area of interest to you as a potential or related college major
- NOTE-This effort is not your teacher's recommendation letter. This is information so your counselor can write a more thorough recommendation letter. Some teachers will only do this or the recommendation letter. Think about what you want and who is willing to give what!
- Pick up a hard copy today from us!

Transcript Request Form

- Forms are online or in Student Services
- Make sure to fill out all areas!
- If all colleges don't fit on the form, submit another one. There is no limit!

Consent to Release Information Form

- NOTHING can be sent if this form is not submitted.
- Parent signature is needed, unless student is 18 and can sign for themselves.
- Waiving rights may be a requirement of your college.
