
The Common Application

- Encouraged to create account early in high school (9th)
- Account can store important documents you may want to use during college application process
- All schools participating have agreed to provide affordable tuition or work with students in order to meet financial need




UK APPLICATION SYSTEM

- If you are thinking about applying to college in the UK there is a system for you
- University and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) <u>www.ucas.com</u>
- Some of the UK schools are now participants in the Common Application
- There is a limit on the amount of schools you can apply to through UCAS

INSTITUTIONAL APPLICATIONS

- Some institutions maintain their own application form
 - i.e. On-site admissions may provide a modified paper form to applicants
- Electronic versions (school specific) may be without cost
- Institutional applications also may provide a alternate forms of applying
 - i.e. Video applications
- If you are applying to less than 4 schools it may be more advantageous to use the institutional application. Common App & Coalition may be too tedious.

NEXT STEPS...SUMMER JUNIOR YEAR

- Visit college campuses or take their online tours.
 - Virginia Private College Open House Week July 24-29, 2017 —Visit three colleges this week and receive three application fee waivers to use at any of the participating private colleges. Learn more at www.vaprivatecolleges.org
- Make a schedule of application deadlines.
- Begin drafting your Common Application or Coalition Application essays.
- Create a resume. List your activities, awards, jobs and other interests outside of school which will help your teachers, coaches and counselor write stronger recommendation letters.
- Register to take the SATs and/or ACT again.
- Begin applying to the colleges/universities on your list. Some will open their applications as early as August 1 for the fall of 2018!
- Look for scholarships and grants!
